- Attendees can include be social workers, pastoral care staff, residential care staff, police, MST staff, youth offending workers

- Working with resistant young people
- Working with Roma, BME groups and learning disabilities
- Dealing with disclosures effectively
- Understanding perpetrators
- Develop a better understanding of working with young people who have additional needs
- Implementing problem solving techniques
- Tips and feedback to workers from young people
